

Steve Battaglia: Regensburg Colloquy of 1541

This was the final attempt to bring unification between Catholics and Protestants. Sadly, the members of each respective party were not able to agree on a few distinct theological ideas thus forging two separate paths within the church. Despite the separation, the Catholic and Protestant theologians did find common ground on the doctrine of justification--that is, how do we become righteous before God--at the Colloquy. This interest group, therefore, seeks to investigate and explain the historical theology surrounding the Regensburg Colloquy of 1541 by discussing its major players, tracing the theological ideas concerning justification, and offering what it means for believers today.
