

#### Glenda Edwards: Baptism in the Holy Spirit

#### Laurel Clark: Mama/Papa Bear Apologetics

Based off of the book, *Mama Bear Apologetics* by Hillary Morgan Ferrer. This will be a discussion-based class between new and seasoned parents (dads are invited too!). We hope to equip young parents with tools as they guide their kids in forming their own biblical beliefs about what is true and what is false. We pray you leave hungry for apologetics and equipped to teach your kids how to think through and address the culture's lies in a critical manner. New parents: come ready to learn! #### Steve Edwards: Christianity and Democracy

Jesus commanded us to "love your neighbor as yourself." (Mark 12:31). But, how do we apply that when even committed Christians have such widely differing and fervently held political views? With half of the country believing the other half is trying to "destroy America" and with many people "unfriending" each other for expressing certain beliefs, can the Bible help us resolve our differences? Do Christians in a democracy have greater obligations and responsibilities than those who live under authoritarian rule? What is meant by the "separation of Church and State?" Does that also mean separating God from the law? Does it mean separating God from your vote?

This is not a forum to convince others why your political beliefs are correct or to debate specific policy issues. This will be an opportunity to share which scriptures and biblical principles you consider paramount in your role as a citizen and to discuss whether there are any political goals upon which all Christians can agree.

#### Brooke and Nita Oftedahl: Finding Your People...Building Community In A Lonely World

In a world that's both more connected and more isolating than ever before, we are often tempted to do life alone, whether because we are too busy or relationships and work are hard. But science confirms that consistent, meaningful connection with others is critical to our well-being. In the book by Jennie Allen, *Find Your People*, she draws from insights in science and timeless Biblical truths to discover how to dive in and experience the wonder of community. Loneliness does not have to be your reality.
